Parent Reminders

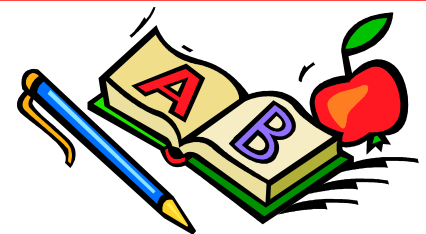
Open House is September 22th from 6:00 – 7:00 PM. The book fair opens at 5:30 PM.
